SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers responded to a residence after receiving a call of a weapon offense that occurred inside. The caller reported that a male brandished a firearm at his girlfriend and they were currently inside the residence. There was no additional information

obtained from the caller and we were unable to call the reporting party back to obtain further details. We formulated a plan and approached the residence to conduct a security check of everyone inside. After making announcements and knocking on the door we observed the lights inside turn off. After further knocking and giving more announcements a female came to the door and was taken outside. A check of the inside was done and a 2 year-old child was inside and taken outside to her other. The male was not located inside the residence and it was determined that he had ran out the back door and jumped fences to the west of the residence, based on fresh footprints located. Additionally, officers had the alleyway covered and did not see anyone come their way. A drone was utilized and nearby backyards were checked, but the male was not located. The female consented to allowing officers to search the residence and two stolen firearms were found with the male's stuff. The female also showed officers the male's Instagram posts which showed he was manufacturing firearms and selling them. The posts also showed him holding firearms/ firearm parts. The male was her boyfriend and It was determined that there was no brandishing of a gun that occurred, and no domestic violence. The male was identified and is a convicted felon from Los Banos. He will have an I&B for his arrest for several felony charges.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers kept an eye on the downtown area and the city parks. Everything seemed quiet. During the night officers responded to a property damage that was ongoing at a local motel. Officers tried to use a catch pole to secure the dog, but he became aggressive and started charging at the officers. Animal Control came out and had to dart the dog. After the medicine worked, the dog was safely taken to animal control.
