The shift started was busy this morning and then slowed down. While responding to an assault/battery that had just occurred, an officer spotted a male matching the description of the suspect. The officer attempted to stop the male and he fled on his bike and then on foot. He was caught and it was determined he had numerous warrants for his arrest. He was booked for the warrants and resisting arrest. A short time later, a male was reportedly walking into traffic and yelling at vehicles. He was non-compliant and walking away. Officers followed him for a while and convinced him to stop. He was detained on a mental health hold and transported to the hospital.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

This July 4th turned out to be a very day for swing shift. During the day, officers responded to a shoplifting at a northern retail store. The suspects fled prior to TPD arrived, but a license plate was obtained and follow-up will be conducted. Officers responded to a death of a resident. She suffered from several medical conditions and was found by her family, who came to visit her. No foul play was evident. As the night progressed, we received numerous fireworks violations. As the firework calls mounted, we were able to utilize our UAS, responding to the locations TPD received calls about. This was extremely helpful. Within 1 hour of flight time, TPD issued approximately 7 different fireworks violations. All observed by the UAS. This does not include the violations that were handled by officers without the use of the UAS. It was also used to follow several suspects who fled from TPD units. The UAS pilot was able to give clear directions of travel and descriptions of the suspects. All were eventually detained without incident. Also during this shift, officers assisted the fire department as they responded to several structure and grass fires.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was a busy 4th of July night, officers responded to several firework violation calls. Numerous citations were issued and many illegal fireworks were confiscated. Officers also responded to an assault & battery call involving domestic violence. The male suspect was wanted by the sheriff's department for a domestic battery that occurred earlier in the night, and we were now responding to another on involving the same people. The male had dragged the female after assaulting her, and when officers arrived they determined both parties were inside of a trailer and were refusing to come out. Officers were able to gain entry and take the suspect into custody. He was booked on the I&B from the sheriff's department, along with fresh charges of domestic battery.
