SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Busy shift throughout the night. Officers investigated a weapons violation that also involved vandalism. Several subjects arrived at the victim's residence and began damaging Christmas decorations in the front yard. When the homeowners confronted them, two of the subjects reportedly brandished firearms before fleeing on foot. Officers conducted an area check for the suspects and located five individuals believed to be involved. However, the victim was ultimately unable to identify which subjects had displayed the firearms or committed the vandalism. Officers responded to disturbance between a couple, which resulted in the arrest of one party for violating a court order. While conducting an extra patrol, officers located a subject passed out in a flower planter. The individual was found to be intoxicated and, due to being unable to care for himself, he was placed under arrest for public intoxication.
