However as emergency calls increased, Fire Department staffing actually decreased. Looking ahead, without this measure the City will have to cut additional firefighting positions which would force the closure of one of its four fire stations. This will drastically increase fire and emergency medical response times in that area of the city. In some instances, these times could double. This measure helps maintain effective fire and emergency medical response services to ensure residents receive the timely help
