## ANIMAL SERVICES:

Animal Services conducted pet license enforcement in various locations throughout the month of April.

## SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

1. S.I.U. hosted a Regional Apprehension Team (R.A.T.) operation with Stanislaus Probation where over twenty (20) residences and forty (40) subjects were searched and five (5) arrests were made.
2. V.I.P.S. began a 10 week Regional Volunteer Training course.
3. On April 30, 2019, T.S.U. hosted a C.I.T.E. (Countywide Integrated Traffic Enforcement) operation. It was a successful operation that focused efforts in areas known for hazardous driving habits. Units from the Sheriff's Office, C.H.P. and Ceres Police Department assisted in the operation that resulted in eighty (80) citations.
