1. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT 2013-04 (SEVENTH DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH SIGN)

To authorize the installation of one internally illuminated 6' tall 11'4" wide monument sign at the Seventh-Day Adventist Church. Four lines of changeable copy are proposed for each side of the sign. This project is located at 2400 N. Olive Ave, more particularly described as Assessor's Parcel No. 072-024-017. - 2. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT 2013-05 (MONTE VISTA CROSSINGS SOUTH PYLON SIGN) To authorize the construction of a new 85-foot tall 21-foot wide multi-tenant freeway sign. As proposed the sign will allow for up to 12 tenants for a total of approximately 410 square feet of sign area per side. The sign will be similar in construction to the two existing pylon signs to the north. The proposed sign will serve the Monte Vista Crossings South commercial/retail development. The project is located at 2701 Countryside Drive, more particularly described as Stanislaus County Assessor's Parcel No. 088-002-070. The proposed project is Exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act under Section 15311 [On-Premise Signs] of the CEQA Guidelines and the City of Turlock CEQA Implementing Procedures Part IV(b).
